a. Security.

- (2) Building is located within I.G.Farben enclosure. Enclosure guarded by I.G. Farben police.
- (3) Internal telephone system established this month with switchboard at entrance and one phone per floor.
- (4) Valuable manuscripts, Holy Scrolls (Toroth), religious ceremonial articles, Masonic ceremonial articles neatly arranged in cabinets, barred with iron bars and room itself partitioned off from other rooms and doors locked. For inventory of valuable items see Inclosure 5.

b. State of Repair: Fair.

c. Maintenance.

- (1) Heating system and plumbing repaired and put in working condition.
- (2) Windows, floors, shelves, cabinets and other furnishings washed and cleaned thoroughly.
- (3) Loose glass around building removed.

d. Heating Supplies.

- (1) 8 containers, acetylene gas, secured from Hanau Engineer Supply Depot to repair steam radiators.
- (2) 90 tons of coal (Nuss No. 2) secured. Sufficient to heat plant until summer.

4. Receipt of Documents.

- a. 833 cases, wooden, standard, approximately 200 tons, transported from Hirzenhain, LK. Büdingen, to Depot with U.S. Army trucks, semi-trailer type, capacity, 10 tons, during first two weeks of March. Cases contain Free Masonic books and other library materials from various European countries, largely Holland and France. Very poor condition since they were not stored properly. Move completed.
- b. All books and other library materials stored at the Frankfurt City Library building, 15 Untermainkai, Frankfurt-am-Main, which required sorting and preparation for restitution brought to Depot. During March, 1946, about 20 truckloads, 2 1/2 ton, were brought to Depot completing the movement which was commenced around December, 1945.
- c. Holy Scrolls (Toroth) and other religious ceremonial articles stored temporarily at the Fine Arts Collecting Point, Wiesbaden, returned to this Depot, Wednesday, 20 March 1946.

The inclosed list is tentative and reliable only insofar as there are at least some books identified as belonging to the institutional or private library collections listed therein. It must not be assumed that the books are segregated in neat piles and available for restitution as separate library collections beyond that which it is deemed advisable to hasten restitution.

- b. Sorting Program.
(See Inclosure 8).

The whole success of the Depot program at present centers around the sorting program. Four definite phases have been delineated, only the fourth requiring specialists versed in Hebrew and Slavic languages.

- (1) Testing of Closed Boxes to determine whether material therein belongs to one nation or is in an unsorted state. This process will be completed within two weeks.
- (2) Dividing all unsorted piles of items into identifiable items and unidentifiable items. This process was commenced 26 Mar 46.
- (3) Sorting the piles of identifiable items by country of origin where possible. This process was commenced 15 Mar 46.
- (4) Sorting of semi-identifiable items, with various types of stamps and markings, legible and otherwise, largely in Hebrew script and the Slavic languages. This process has not yet been commenced.

8. Recommendations.

- a. Need for additional personnel. One U.S.Civilian, Library Specialist, salary ca. \$ 6,000 per annum. This specialist should be capable of succeeding the Director of the Depot when he is redeployed, May 1946. Date of assumption of duties should be not later than 15 April 1946.
- b. Depot as sole archival restitution agency. A letter has been forwarded through channels on 26 March 1946 recommending that this Depot be designated as the "sole archival depot in the US Zone whereto all books and other library materials be moved when sorting by country of origin is required prior to restitution". Inclosure 3, "Floor Plan of the Depot", gives one a graphic idea on how well adapted the physical layout of the building is toward effectuating successfully such a program.

SUBJECT: Establishment of the Offenbach Archival Depot

THRU: Commanding Officer, Det E-3

TO: Commanding Officer, Det F-13

1. The Offenbach Collecting Point is hereby redesignated the OFFENBACH ARCHIVAL DEPOT. The Depot is declared a first priority Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives restitution project and placed directly under the supervision of the Land Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives Specialist Officer, OMG for Greater Hesse.

2. The Land Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives Specialist Officer, OMG for Greater Hesse, will designate a Director of the Offenbach Archival Depot and supervise his activities.

3. The Director of the Offenbach Archival Depot will:

- a. Establish and maintain liaison with all Allied and other officially-designated Restitution Officers assigned or attached to US Forces, European Theater, and assist them in making available for restitution, books and such other properties as are clearly identifiable as to country of origin.
- b. Make recommendations as to the disposition of such books and properties as are not identifiable as to country of origin.
- c. Procure personnel and direct their activities.
- d. Provide adequate security, supply transportation and maintenance.
- e. Supervise the storage, warehousing, boxing, crating, and shipping of all books and other properties formerly administered by the Offenbach Collecting Point.
- f. Prepare military correspondence in the name of the Director, this headquarters, in matters pertaining to the Offenbach Archival Depot only.

- g. Perform such other duties and functions as are directed by the Land Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives Specialist Officer, OMG for Greater Hesse.
4. Upon the request of the Director of the Offenbach Archival Depot, The Offices of Military Government for Rbz. Wiesbaden, Rbz. Hessen, LK and SK Offenbach and SK Frankfurt will either provide or direct, through the appropriate agencies of the civil government, provision for such personnel, transportation, supplies, warehousing facilities, fuel, and housing and food for Depot employees as are required for the efficient operation of the installation.



2. Obergeschoss - 2nd floor





I. Duties of the Police:

- a) To check all passes, bags, briefcases, and boxes of the employees
- b) To patrol the building periodically
- c) To make sure that all doors and windows are closed at night, and that all lights are out after working hours.
- d) To make sure that the Director is notified immediately in case of theft, fire, or any other emergency
- e) To circulate through the building and in the vicinity of the building, except at times when the workers come and go. Should the doorman at any time have difficulties with either the visitors or employees, the policeman is to assist him in his capacity as representative of the law.

II. Duties of the Doormen:

- a) To check workers in and out
- b) To operate the switchboard
- c) To keep a list of all visitors coming into the building.
